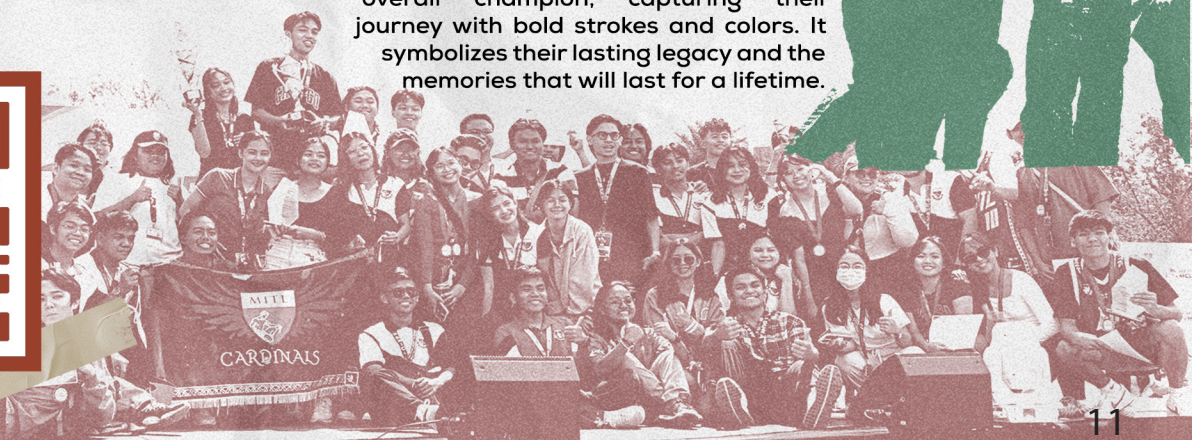
The Mapúa Institute of Technology in Laguna (MITL) Cardinals clinched yet another championship title for their department at the Mapúa Malaysian Colleges Laguna (Mapúa MCL)'s Wizards' Cup 2024 last January 23 to 24, 2024.

Being hailed as the **"Department of the Year"** during the Awarding Ceremony last **January 26, 2024**, this monumental win of the MITL Department continues its legacy as the **defending champion from last year's Wizards' Cup**. What paved their two-peat victory is the fact that they managed to **champion 12 out of the 29** different athletic and skill-based events that were held throughout the tournament and garnered a total of **3,100 points**.

In total, six departments of **Mapúa MCL** contended for the coveted title, namely: the crowned **MITL Cardinals**, the **College of Computer and Information Science (CCIS) Mavens**, the **College of Marine Engineering and Transportation (CMET) Marines**, **Enrique T. Yuchengco College of Business (ETYCB) Candors**, the **College of Arts and Science (CAS) Elixirs**, and the **Senior High School (SHS) Vipers**. After their battles in various sporting events that exhibited the skill, talent, and sportsmanship of Mapúans, right next to the Cardinals are the **SHS Vipers as the first runner-up with 2,220 points** and the **CCIS Mavens as the second runner-up with 1,960 points**.

Literacy, community go hand-in-hand

To celebrate the International Book Giving Day last February 14, 2024, a group of second-year Bachelor of Arts in Communication students launched "Chapters of Change: A Book Donation Drive", an initiative that strived to nurture a lifetime appreciation of reading in Mapúa Malayan Colleges Laguna (Mapúa MCL) and its beneficiaries.


Specifically, Mapúans were encouraged to donate their books in boxes placed in the Enrique T. Yuchengco (ETY) Building Lobby, the Gymnasium, and the Student Lounge. Initially, the book donation drive was supposed to be a one-day event. However, due to demand from offices and students, it was extended until February 16.

"We chose to hold the book donation drive on International Book Giving Day to further express our purpose: to shed light on our beneficiary and encourage Mapúans to become part of the change we wanted to create, which was to increase the literacy of children in Paete and develop their love for reading," said Alessandra Marie Escueta, one of the organizers of the aforementioned initiative.

After the donation drive, the 169 books collected—far from the organizers' goals of just 30—were directly donated to the Kwentuhan Series, a non-governmental organization (NGO) based in Paete, Laguna spearheaded by teacher Celine Anne Delos Reyes, also known as 'Ma'am C'. On the other hand, when asked whether they plan on continuing such an initiative, Ms. Escueta stated that she wants to make Chapters of Change an annual book donation drive for B.A. Communication students every International Book Giving Day.

As the whale swims through the skies and is the "paper boy" of donated books, it hopes to encourage literacy among curious individuals and to appreciate reading through sharing.

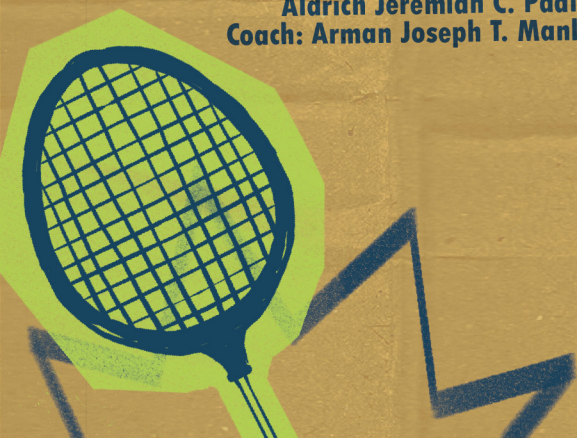

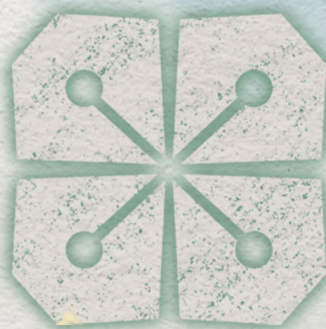
