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
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Mapúa MCL's graduates words samantha Louise Leonardo observe first ever Send-off Celebration •

BACK TO SCHOOLS MAPÚA MCS LAUNCHES 14-WEEK TERM FORMAT

Last August 22, 2023, Mapúa Malayan Colleges Laguna (Mapúa MCL) started its college classes for the Academic Year 2023-2024 by welcoming new and old Mapúan students.

For the freshmen, this was their first time to explore the institution's environment, meet their fellow students, and be acquainted with their professors in their respective courses. On the other hand, for the upperclassmen, this was their chance to expand upon their college journeys, considering the changes for this Academic Year.

To be more precise, both new and old students were introduced to the 14-week term curriculum instead of the old 12-week format. Notably, the major changes were the additional two-week allotment per semester, the redistribution of miscellaneous fees worth 3,400 pesos, the increase in the minimum and maximum units per term to 15 and 18 units, and shortened lab and lecture hours. Moreover, the Midyear Term was removed due to the added two weeks to the regular term schedule.

The administration advised that time and proper adjustments are needed to fully assimilate to these modifications. Despite the worries of the Mapúans, they assured that the changes were made to allow for the pursuit of non-academic activities, which creates a more dynamic college experience within the OneMapúan community. Particularly, this was first tested at the Constellate 2023: Emerge to a New Beginning, which is organized by the Mapúa MCL Supreme Student Council (SSC) to welcome all of the Mapúans and provide assistance in understanding the available organizations in the institution.

To proceed, the administration has a line-up of upcoming events or programs for Mapúans to hone their academic and non-academic talents and network with their schoolmates, such as student organizational events and school-wide programs. Both the administrators and current student-leaders encourage everyone to take part in these opportunities as this aforementioned curriculum has only begun.

Also, the first day gave way to the holding of general assemblies, where the various departments and organizations warmly welcomed and oriented their respective old and new members. Furthermore, booth operations and general assemblies continued to take place on the second day of the Constellate.

The Mapúa Institute of Technology in Laguna (MITL) Cardinals clinched yet another championship title for their department at the Mapúa Malayan Colleges Laguna (Mapúa MCL)'s Wizards' Cup 2024 last January 23 to 24, 2024.

Being hailed as the "Department of the Year" during the Awarding Ceremony last January 26, 2024, this monumental win of the MITL Department continues its legacy as the defending champion from last year's Wizards' Cup. What paved their two-peat victory is the fact that they managed to champion 12 out of the 29 different athletic and skill-based events that were held throughout the tournament and garnered a total of 3,100 points.

In total, six departments of Mapúa MCL contended for the coveted title, namely: the crowned MITL Cardinals, the College of Computer and Information Science (CCIS) Mavens, the College of Marine Engineering and Transportation (CMET) Marines, Enrique T. Yuchengco College of Business (ETYCB) Candors, the College of Arts and Science (CAS) Elixirs, and the Senior High School (SHS) Vipers. After their battles in various sporting events that exhibited the skill, talent, and sportsmanship of Mapúans, right next to the Cardinals are the SHS Vipers as the first runner-up with 2,220 points and the CCIS Mavens as the second runner-up with 1,960 points.

Last April 27, Mapúa Malayan Colleges Laguna (Mapúa MCL) conducted a showcase event, featuring the new department, the Mapúa Institute of Aviation (MIA), at Rooms E301 to E303 of the Einstein Building. This event aimed to impart amongst the attendees brand new information regarding the new addition to Mapúa MCL's offerings, the Bachelor of Science in Aeronautical Engineering (BS AeE), starting this upcoming Academic Year 2024-2025.

To start, the aviation showcase provided a sneak peek of the blueprint of the building delegated to the MIA Department, which is the Da Vinci building. To be located at the front of the Einstein Building of Mapúa MCL, the aforementioned facility will consist of student lounges, a swimming pool, and additional air-conditioned classrooms.

Additionally, the Beechcraft Sierra, the first airplane introduced during the whole session, is promised to provide incoming aviation students with hands-on experiences that will help them master their skills in operating, piloting, and tinkering with aircrafts.

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This introduction to what is coming next in the institution was followed by the presence of Captain Michael John P. Reyes, the Dean of MIA and the speaker of the seminar. During the talk, he engaged with the attendees through his sharing of insights about the basic concepts of aeronautics, the crucial role of aviation in the industry, potential career paths in the aforementioned field, the longevity of the program, and the equipment and facilities to be present in supporting the overall college journey of future Mapúan pilots.

Subsequently, concerns with regards to the new developments and the idea of aviation in Mapúa MCL were addressed during the question-and-answer portion. One of which was the concern about when the building, equipment, and facilities to be used in MIA's curricular activities will be available, to which Capt. Reyes disclosed that these would be established before the Academic Year ends. Furthermore, any additional necessary items for aeronautical studies will simply follow through.

Aside from this meeting, another event associated with the introduction of new changes in Mapúa MCL happened during the Mapúa MCL EduQuest, the institution's year-end promotional activities dedicated to incoming Mapúans, last July 30 at the Global Classroom. Capt. Reyes, who is also the speaker for this talk, once again shared his insights for those who are interested and willing to venture into the field of aviation.

To conclude, the new program will take flight in the upcoming Academic Year 2024-2025, opening a call for students who want to pursue aeronautical engineering within Laguna and nearby provinces.


